Walking home from school as an 9 year old girl, I could see her big, blue Cadillac parked in the driveway. "Nana Bea" was here! She lived down on the South Shore, and it was always exciting when she would make the drive to come and stay with us. Somedays it was just a few days, other times it could be a week or two. Our days would include playing the three special games she kept had in the trunk of the Blue Caddy, many sing-a-longs, and lots of laughter. When my kids ask about my Nana Bea, they are often perplexed about why she would stay over. It's hard for them to understand why she would need to stay; it's only an hour and a half drive, something we've done for a sports game only to return home at the end of it. It's hard to explain to them how we simply weren't as dependent on our cars back them, or how GPS, Siri and even Yahoo maps didn't exist.

According to AAA, today, the average American spends 17,600 minutes driving each year compared to 7,957 minutes per year in 1980 (according to USDOT). So much has changed just in these 40 years, especially for those over the age of 60! Driving down the road today there are more cars and traffic to contend with, flashing signs everywhere, drivers watching their

Circuit Breaker Informational Session Rose Baker Senior Center Thursday, February 21: 10:00 am

Do You Qualify for a Tax Credit and May not be Aware? Sponsored by Senator Bruce Tarr:

Mr. Brian Lynch, Department of Revenue, will offer a session at the Gloucester Council on Aging/Rose Baker Senior Center, Thursday, February 21, 2019, 10:00—11:00 am, and discuss the Senior Circuit Breaker Tax Credit that is available to qualifying Massachusetts residents who are age 65 and over.

Discussion will include eligibility and qualifying criteria, how to calculate one's CB Credit amount, and how to file and receive the refundable credit from the Commonwealth through the Massachusetts Department of Revenue.

Cape Ann seniors are invited to attend. Following the presentation, a Soup and Salad Bar (without reservation) and a complete Nutrition Program meal (RSVP required) is being offered without charge. We will appreciate receiving a count for those attending the luncheon.





There are a number of scams out there that target seniors, and unfortunately Essex Residents are not immune! Just last month we were contacted by a resident who received a call from "Medicare" looking to verify her new

card number. Fortunately, this resident did not give out any information, but the scammer also began asking specific questions about neighbors. Medicare, the IRS, Social Security will NOT contact you by phone for any reason. Do not give out any information. Typically, they are looking for

- Your birth date.
- Your birthplace.
- Your Social Security or you Medicare number.
- Your mother's maiden name.
- Either your entire credit card number, or the last eight digits of the number.
- Your bank account numbers.

Never give any information to someone who calls you. If you believe you've been victim to a scam such as this, please contact the Essex Police Department.

<u>Property Tax Resources</u> Circuit Breaker Tax Credit: As

a senior citizen, you may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on your personal state income tax return. Whether you own or rent your home (Public housing residents are not eligible). Your refund is determined based on a comparison of 10% of your income and your property taxes, or 25% of your rent. The maximum credit amount for tax year 2018 is \$1,100. To apply, complete Mass Form 1.

Property Tax Exemptions:

You must meet certain ownership and domiciliary requirements in addition to those listed. For more information see Kristin or Tess at the Essex Senior Center, or Brenda at the Assessor's Office

Blind Exemption: Clause 37A \$500.00 You must have a current Certificate from

You must have a current Certificate from the Mass. Commission for the Blind.

Senior Exemption: Clause 41C \$500.00

You must be 70 or older. Income must not exceed \$15,905 (Single) or \$18,351 (couple). Assets must be below \$34,254 (single) or \$36,703 (married)

Veteran's Exemption: Clauses 22, 22A-F \$400 to full exemption The applicant must have a 10% or greater service connected disability. Exemption amount is dependent on disability rating.

Property Tax Deferral

You may defer up to 50% of you property taxes if you are over age 65 and have an income less than \$20,000. Interest rates do apply and the taxes are due when you are no longer eligible, sell the home, or pass away.

How is the Angel Gabriel connected to Essex? By Laurel Eisenhauer

The Angel Gabriel was one of five ships traveling from Bristol, England to the colonies in 1635. It was shipwrecked on August 14-15, 1635 in the harbor at Pemaquid, Maine during a major hurricane. Despite many attempts the wreckage has ever been located. A trunk belonging to the Cogswell family survived and is on display at the Colonial Pemaquid Museum.

Most of the passengers were on land and survived the storm and eventually made their way to towns in southern New Hampshire and northeast Massachusetts. Several came to Ipswich and settled there or in Chebacco Parish (which later became the separate town of Essex). One of the passengers –John Cogswell - established a farm on land granted to him. This is now called Cogswell's Grant in Essex.

Names of passengers believed to be on the Angle Gabriel: Andrews, Bailey, Beck, Burnham, Blaesdell, Cogswell, Furber, Haines, Hook, Simpson, Tuttle. Some people think the ship on top of the Town Hall represents the ship Angel Gabriel.

You may be eligible to become a Permanent Absentee Voter if a physical disability makes you unable to:

- * travel to the polls to vote
- * fill out a ballot without assistance

In order to apply to become a permanent absentee voter, you will need to obtain a signed letter from your doctor on their letterhead which explains your disability and certifies their agreement that you are eligible to become a permanent absentee voter.



You only need to do that once! Submit the letter to the Town Clerk and it will be kept on file.
