It has certainly been a long and difficult couple of months. If you are like me, you probably are looking forward to return to normal. It's exciting that things are starting to open. As recommended by Governor Baker and the health experts, please continue to be cautious and remember that even though things are slowly opening, we are all still safer at home. With this in mind, The Essex Senior Center will continue to be closed to the public at least through the month of June. We are working with the Massachusetts Councils on Aging, Executive Office of Elder Affairs, and the Essex Board of Health on when we will reopen and how that looks. I wish I had a clear answer for you, but as you know this is quite a fluid situation. While we are 'closed' to the public, please don't forget both Kristin and Tess are working, and here to help!

We will continue to offer grab and go meals on Mondays, as well as grocery pick ups throughout the month. If you are able to participate in a curbside pick up at either Open Door or Acord we would encourage you to do so. We will continue to offer programming through Zoom, and will be looking to expand options. We are also available to assist with numerous other services, such as Medicare Counseling, SNAP Benefits, Resources, Housing, and much more.

As you already know, Governor Baker has laid out a plan for reopening Massachusetts. Each phase is expected to last 3 weeks, however transitions are going to be dependent on health metrics. More details about the Phases 1 and 2 can be found on page 7. Movement between phases is dependent on positive trends. The specific trends being looked at are:

- * COVID-19 Positive Test Rate
- * Number of COVID-19 Hospitalizations
- * Testing Capacity

- * Number of COVID-19 related deaths
- * Healthcare System Readiness
- * Contact Tracing Capabilities

We will keep you as updated as possible through our newsletter, as well as through weekly calls. If you aren't receiving a phone call from us with important updates, it means that we don't have a number for you. Please call or email us with your contact information. We do hope that we can see you soon.

Annual Town Meeting June 13, 2020

The Essex Board of Selectmen voted to reschedule the 2020 Annual Town Meeting to a new date of Saturday June 13, 2020. at 10:00AM. The meeting will be held outdoors on the grounds of the Essex Elementary School, 12 Story Street. Please wear you own face covering, however disposable masks will be available. Chairs will be set up to 6 feet apart. The warrant can be found at www.essexma.org, or a paper copy can be picked up at the Senior Center. Please call to let us know you would like one.

Annual Town Election June 22, 2020

The Essex Board of Selectmen voted to reschedule the Annual Town Election to a new date of June 22, 2020. The election will be held at the Essex Memorial Fire Station, 24 Martin Street. Polls will be open from 12:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. The Act also allows for increasing voting options by mail for this election; namely by absentee ballot for any person taking precautions related to COVID-19 and by early voting by mail for any reason (ballots are now available at Town Hall).

Absentee and Early Ballot Applications can be downloaded from the MA Secretary of the Commonwealth's website, the Town Clerk's page on the Town of Essex website, www.essexma.org, or mailed to you by request to the Essex Town Clerk. The ONLY (but important) difference between Absentee and Early ballots are that once you return a completed ballot to election officials, only a person who voted by Absentee ballot may appear in person at the polls on election day to request a new ballot. That person may ONLY vote with the new ballot if their first ballot has not yet been processed.

The deadline to register to vote for the June 22, 2020 election is Friday, June 12. The Board of Registrars will hold a registration session at Town Hall on June 12th from 2pm to 4pm and from 7pm to 8pm.

Medicare Questions?



Are you turning 65 in the next three months?

Are you over 65 and need to enroll soon?

Do you understand your Medicare deadlines and options?

Are you having trouble paying for medical expenses and prescription drugs?

If any of these apply to you, contact the **SHINE** (Serving Health Insurance Needs of Everyone...on Medicare) program. Certified SHINE counselors offer free, confidential counseling on all aspects of health insurance to anyone on Medicare. Kristin Crockett is the SHINE Counselor here in Essex. You may also call 1-800-AGE-INFO and press 4. Once you get the SHINE answering machine, leave your name, phone number and town. A counselor will call you back as soon as possible. Please note that the return call may come from a restricted number.

If you missed your opportunity to apply for Medicare Part A and/or Medicare Part B due to closures at Social Security, you may have more time to enroll without penalty. An extension has been granted through June 17, 2020. If this applies to you, please get in touch with a SHINE Counselor for assistance.

Registry of Motor Vehicles Updates:

The Registry of Motor Vehicles announced additional extensions to licenses, inspections, and registrations. Here are the new expirations dates for licenses/IDs:

Reopening of Massachusetts

On May 18th, Governor Baker announced the 4 phased approach to reopening Massachusetts. We have included the general guidelines for Phases 1 and 2. At the time of printing we were entering Phase 1, with Phase 2 anticipated to start no sooner than June 8. Please be sure to check with an individual business/location/provider on their specific policies.

Please note that moving from one phase to another is dependent on positive trends in health metrics listed on pg 1.

As residents of Massachusetts, we are all in this together. Across all phases of reopening, please:





Wash your



Socially



Be vigilant for symptoms



Stay home if you feel sick

Phase 1

- Gathering size is still less than 10, and there is a safer at home advisory
- Essential Businesses are still open
- These businesses will be open with restrictions:
 - * Limited Personal Services, including hair, pet grooming and car washes
 - * Retail, with remote fulfillment / curbside pickup
- Health Care Providers may provide high priority preventative care, and treatment for high-risk conditions
- Under specific guidelines these recreational/outdoor locations may open: Beaches; Parks; Drive-in Theaters; some athletic fields; some outdoor adventure activities, most fishing, hunting and boating; outdoor zoos, gardens, reserves, and public installations.
- Worship services with specific guidelines

Phase 2

- Gathering size TBD, Business and Recreational travel discouraged
- These businesses will be able to open, with restrictions:
 - * Restaurants, Lodging, Retail, Additional Personal Services, including Nail Salons, and Day
- Expanded ambulatory health care, including less urgent preventative services, procedures, and care (dental cleanings and certain elective procedures)
- Day Programs, such as Adult Day Health
- Under specific guidelines these recreational/outdoor locations may open: Campgrounds; playgrounds and spray decks; Public and community pools; all athletic fields and courts; youth sports in limited fashion ^^^^^
