



Population change Essex




Age distribution of population Essex v. State 1990




Age distribution of population Essex v. State 2000




Age distribution of population Essex v. State 2010



Age distribution of population Essex v. State 2012-2016 ACS
















Population by race Essex





Housing units by building type Essex v. State





Year householder moved into unit Essex v. State





Housing stock by year built Essex v. State






Educational attainment Essex v. State

GOAL NINE: Meet the housing needs of all Essex residents

- To achieve this goal, the Essex SPC recommends the Town take the following actions:
- a) Adopt a Mixed-Use Zoning By-Law (2nd floor residential over commercial) to enable better utilization of already developed land.
- b) Allow "in-law" apartments (through zoning change).
- c) Examine affordable housing needs of current Essex residents.
- d) Determine how best to support housing using CPA funds.
- e) Consider partnering with neighboring communities on a joint housing plan
- f) Conduct a market analysis for the Town.
- g) Apply for grant funding for housing studies.
- h) Explore ways to reduce costs for homeowners, including energy cost savings through MassSave free home energy audits.
