28 good able-bodied men wanted to fill up the quota for the Town of Essex.

150 Dollars Bounty will be paid by the Town;

25 Dollars Bounty will be paid by the United States;

13 Dollars for one month's pay in advance;

188 Dollars will be paid to each Volunteer on being mustered into service.

75 Dollars Bounty will be paid by the United States at the expiration of his time of enlistment or upon being honorably discharged.

State and Town aid for the families of Volunteers according to the necessity of each case up to 20 Dollars per month.
