Medicare Open Enrollment

Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year—things like cost, coverage, and which providers and pharmacies are in their networks.

October 15 to December 7 is when all people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year, to better meet their needs. Please make an appointment to review your plans with Tess.

OPEN ENROLLMENT FAQs:

What is Open Enrollment?

Open enrollment is the one time of year in which you can change your Medicare Advantage Plans and/or your Part D Prescription Drug Coverage.

I am happy with my coverage, do I really need to do anything during the Open Enrollment Period? If you do nothing, and your plan will continue to be offered next year, your plan will carry over. However, Medicare Advantage Plans and Prescription Drug Plans do make changes each year - and due to the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 we expect to see some changes for folks with high prescription costs! You should still compare plans to see if better coverage is available.

Can choosing a new drug plan really make a difference? Can switching plans make a difference in out-of-pocket costs? In 2024, several plans have increases of more than 100%! Do you know if your plan is included? Some plans have been discontinued and members will be automatically enrolled into another plan by the same company. This may not be your best option.

Are there programs to help with prescription costs? There are a number of programs to help reduce medical and prescription costs. Please make an appointment with a SHINE Counselor to learn more about reducing your Medicare Premiums, Drug Costs, and more.

What about the savings I heard about on the news about spending caps and for medications like Entresto, Xarelto, Eliquis, Jardiance, and more?

It is true that there has been federal legislation passed that will result in savings for prescription medications for Medicare beneficiaries and we are excited to see these changes take effect.

Here are the changes taking effect in 2024:

- Elimination of the 5% copay for catastrophic coverage
- Expansion of the Full Extra Help Program:
- Part D Premium increase restrictions

Changes for 2025:

- \$2,000 Out of Pocket Maximum for Part D prescription drugs Changes for 2026-2030
- Negotiations for specific high cost prescriptions implemented

It's important to check your coverage EVERY YEAR!



IMPORTANT UPDATES FOR SPECIFIC MEDICARE PLANS

ELIXIR prescription drugs plans will not be renewed for 2024. If you have one of their plans for 2023, you will NOT be automatically enrolled into another plan!!

<u>Clear Spring Health Premier Rx Plan</u> will not be offered in 2024. If you are on this plan you will be automatically enrolled into another Clear Spring plan. Due to sanctions by Medicare, if you would like to enroll into a continuing Clear Spring plan, you will need to contact the plan directly at 800-317-6082.

<u>TUFTS MEDICARE PREFERRED</u> members should know that Medicare.gov was incorrectly indicating that CVS is a non-preferred pharmacy and therefore pricing estimates obtained during October are likely incorrect. CVS will still be a preferred pharmacy. Please be sure to double check your prescription cost estimates prior to December 7.

On September 12, 2023, the CDC recommended a COVID-19 vaccine updated for 2023-2024 for everyone aged 6 months and older to protect against serious illness. Call your doctor or pharmacist to schedule a vaccine appointment.

What's New with Medicare Advantage Plans?

Medicare Advantage plans are continuing to enhance benefits. In 2024 several plans have expanded dental coverage, added over the counter spending options, and increased health incentives.

Medicare Advantage plans provide "all-in-one shopping" for medical and prescription coverage.

December 7 is the final day of Medicare Open Enrollment make an appointment today!

Please RSVP for events early and ALWAYS include your phone number - even if we already have it!!

Often times programs are limited in space, but also, it helps us with planning and budgeting. Please note that we reserve the right to cancel events if a minimum number of participants are not registered.



Asia

In Thailand there are multiple celebrations - King <u>BHUMIBOL</u>'s Birthday falls on 12/7 and on 12/10 the Thai people celebrate their Independence. <u>VICTORY</u> Day (12/16) celebrates the surrender of the Pakistani army in Bangladesh. Full moons are celebrated in Buddhist culture. <u>UNDUVAP POYA</u>, or <u>SANGHAMITTA</u> Day, is a Sri Lankan celebration held on the full moon of December (12/8). (Hint - <u>Unduvap</u> and <u>Poya</u> are found separately!). Finally, on 12/30 Filipinos celebrate the life of their National hero - Jose <u>RIZAL</u>.
