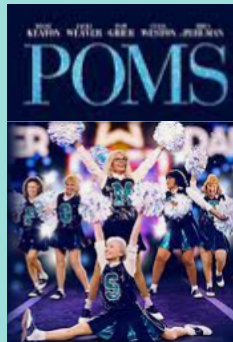

Celebrate National Egg Day ~ Saturday, June 3rd

Ingredients:

- 1/3 Cup chopped mushrooms
- 1 tsp butter
- 1 egg
- 3 TBSP 2% milk
- 1/8 tsp pepper
- Dash ground nutmeg
- 1/4 cup shredded Swiss cheese
- 1 tsp real bacon bits
- 1 tsp minced chives

Directions:

1. In a small skillet, saute the mushrooms in butter until softened. In a small bowl, beat egg, milk, pepper and nutmeg. Stir in the mushrooms, cheese, bacon and chives.
2. Pour into a 5-in. pie plate coated with cooking spray. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes or until set. Let stand for 5 minutes before serving.

Concerned about Medicare Costs? There may be help!



Massachusetts recently increased the income and asset requirements for many programs. Did you know that if your income falls below \$2,309 per month, and your assets are below \$18,810 you may be eligible payment of your Medicare premium? (\$3,123 monthly income for a couple and \$27,260 in assets) This is a savings of at least \$164.90 per month!

A “SOCIAL HEARING AID”

Practicing these communication strategies boosts hearing and social happiness for all people at any hearing level. During times of social distancing and face masks, pencil and paper, marker with whiteboard, or smart phone captioning apps may be necessary.

1. Get the Listener’s attention FIRST! - especially if they are reading or otherwise preoccupied. Establish the topic....or a memory. Then, be sure to let the Listener know when you change the topic.
2. Slow down! Speak slowly and distinctly in your normal conversation voice, no shouting please.
3. Please speak to the Listener while in the same room! Never try to converse from another room.
4. Always talk to each other “face to face”. Please don’t talk to anyone’s back. Speech Reading is a skill the Hard of Hearing Community uses!
5. Please finish your talk with the Listener before turning and walking away – and do not let your voice soften at the end of sentences.
6. CONTROL YOUR ENVIRONMENT! Make sure your voice is as loud as or LOUDER than the background noise (water running, radio, dishwashing machine, TV playing, or other people talking, etc.). If not...move to a quieter place such as a corner or into another room.
7. Let the Listener see your wonderful face! Please don’t obstruct the view of your mouth while speaking...Keep your face well illuminated...no shadows – Speech Reading skills! Put Listener’s back to the bright light.
8. REPHRASE rather than repeat – avoid repeating word sounds that the Listener is missing in the situation.
9. Let the Listener know you will explain later if necessary. Never say, “Never mind.” The Listener may say, “Do you mind trying again?”
10. Please be patient, supportive, and loving. Try to avoid judging or blame when feeling the effects of your shared communication disorder...

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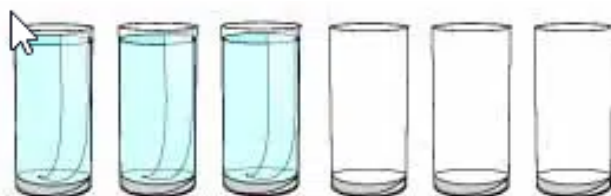
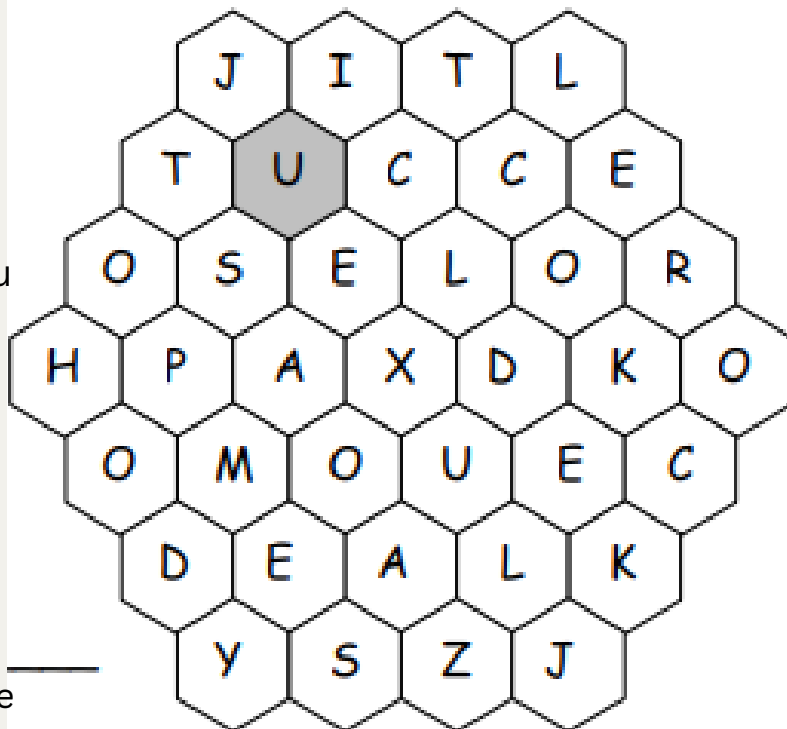

Around Town



If you haven't heard, the Town of Essex did not pass the proposed budget override for the Manchester-Essex Schools. This means that the town may be asked to vote on a new budget. Stay tuned for more information.

Massachusetts has enacted no excuse vote by mail for all elections and you can apply to receive a ballot for all elections held in a given year. Also, If you have a health condition, disability that prevents you from voting in person, you can apply to become a permanent absentee voter. Submit a note written and signed by your doctor on their letterhead which explains your disability and certifies their agreement that you are eligible to become a permanent absentee voter. You only need to do that once! Please reach out to the Town Clerk if you have more questions. 
