- $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon olive oil
- 4 ounces ground Italian sausage
- 1/4 cup chopped onions
- 1/4 cup chopped green bell peppers
- 1 clove garlic , minced
- 2 tablespoons marinara sauce , divided
- 5 slices pepperoni
- ¹/₄ cup shredded mozzarella cheese

Preheat the oven to 350°F (177°C).
Heat oil in over medium heat. Add sausage, cook, stirring occasionally until sausage has browned, 5 min.

^s 3) Add chopped onions, chopped green bell peppers, and minced garlic to the pan and cook for 2 minutes, stirring frequently. Scoop mixture onto a paper towel-lined plate to drain the grease.

4) Coat the bottom of a 10-ounce ramekin with 1 tablespoon of marinara sauce. Line the bottom of the dish with the pepperoni slices.

^{5e} 5) Add sausage and vegetables, smoothing it out into an even layer.

6) Spoon the remaining marinara sauce on top of the sausage layer.

7) Top with shredded mozzarella cheese and place the ramekin on a rimmedbaking sheet to catch any possible spills. Bake for 10 minutes.

8) Remove from the oven and let it rest for 5 minutes before enjoying it.




