



- Create reporting calendar, process
- Agree with town leaders, present to public



## We asked you to develop goals





AND: Work with Town officials to collect available baseline data in key areas

- At our next meeting in late June we will be taking our first crack at developing measurable goals across our main issue areas: town ops/facilities; economic development; transportation, nat/his/rec resources; housing; and community services
- In advance of that meeting, <u>all SPC members are</u> asked to come prepared with 2-3 goal proposals in each issue area. At the beginning of the session they will be asked to write them and then the discussion will go from there
- On the goals we want to phrase them in a measurable, time sensitive way:

Increase X from \_\_ to \_\_ by 20\_\_
