ARTICLE 4: FY 2020 ELECTED OFFICERS SALARY AND COMPENSATION

To see if the Town will vote to fix the salary and compensation of each of the elected officers of the Town as required by Massachusetts General Law Chapter 41, Section 108, as amended, for fiscal year 2020 in accordance with the recommendations of the Personnel Board Report, a copy of which is on file in the Town Clerk's office and is incorporated herein by reference; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Peter D. Phippen moved that the Town fix the salary and compensation of each of the elected officers of the Town as required by Massachusetts General Law Chapter 41, Section 108, as amended, for fiscal year 2020 in accordance with the recommendations of the Personnel Board Report. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 5: FY 2020 PAYMENTS TO MA CLEAN WATER TRUST

To see if the Town will vote to transfer from the Town Septic Betterment Fund a sum of money for the purpose of making necessary payments to the Massachusetts Clean Water Trust during fiscal year 2020 in accordance with the terms of repayment for Community Septic Management Program loan funds; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Lisa J. O'Donnell moved that the Town vote to transfer from the Town Septic Betterment Fund the sum of \$38,684 for the purpose of making necessary payments to the Massachusetts Clean Water Trust during fiscal year 2020 in accordance with the terms of repayment for Community Septic Management Program loan funds. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 6: MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow, a sufficient sum of money to fund and implement a collective bargaining agreement between the Town and the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, Local 2905, AFL-CIO; or take any other

action relating thereto.

Motion: Andrew C. Spinney moved that the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,129, to appropriate from Sewer Department receipts the sum of \$1,939, and to appropriate from Water Department receipts the sum of \$4,091, for a total appropriation of \$16,159, to fund and implement a collective bargaining agreement between the Town and the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, Local 2905, AFL-CIO. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 7: POLICE BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow, a sufficient sum of money to fund and implement a collective bargaining agreement between the Town and the Police Benevolent Association of Essex, Massachusetts Coalition of Police, International Union of Police Associations, AFL-CIO; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Lisa J. O'Donnell moved that the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,142 to fund and implement a collective bargaining agreement between the Town and the Police Benevolent Association of Essex, Massachusetts Coalition of Police, International Union of Police Associations, AFL-CIO. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 8: FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

To hear and act upon the Report of the Finance Committee and to vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds a sum of money for the Town charges and expenditures for the ensuing year, and to authorize the Finance Committee to permit budget line item transfers within a department from salary lines to salary lines and from expense lines to expense lines; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Benjamin Buttrick moved that the Town vote to appropriate the sum of \$8,051,906 as follows: a) raise by taxation the sum of \$1,557,638 for debt repayment, principal and interest; b) transfer from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Fund the sum of \$3,600 to the Cemetery Budget; c) transfer from the Cemetery Lot Care Fund the sum of \$7,338 to the Cemetery Budget; d) transfer from the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund the sum of \$1,206 to the Cemetery Budget; e) transfer from the Town Technology Fund the sum of \$12,150 to the Town IT Budget, f) transfer from the Ambulance Fund the sum of \$50,000 to the Ambulance Budget; g) transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$200,000 to the Health Insurance Budget; h) transfer from the Street Lighting Fund the sum of \$3,000 to the Street Lighting Maintenance and Repair Budget; and i) to raise by taxation the sum of \$6,216,974 to be allocated between the salaries and expenses of the Town according to the remaining budget items as indicated in the Finance Committee Report; and to authorize the Finance Committee to permit budget line item transfers within a department from salary lines to salary lines and from expense lines to expense lines. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved by the Majority declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 9: FY 2019 SEWER ENTERPRISE FUND

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money for the purpose of funding the Sewer Enterprise Fund for the remainder of fiscal year 2019; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Trescott DeWitt moved that Article 9 be indefinitely postponed. The motion was duly seconded. **Action:** *Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator*

ARTICLE 10: FY 2020 SEWER ENTERPRISE FUND

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money for the purpose of funding the Sewer Enterprise Fund for fiscal year 2020; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Trescott DeWitt moved that the Town vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,141,784 for the Sewer Enterprise Fund Budget as follows: a) debt repayment, principal and interest – the sum of \$915,132 from sewer betterments and the sum of \$328,911 to be raised by taxation; and b) funds to be allocated between the salaries and expenses of the Sewer Department – \$897,741 from departmental receipts; all as indicated in the Finance Committee Report; and to authorize the Finance Committee to permit budget line item transfers within the Sewer Department from salary lines to salary lines and from expense lines to expense lines. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 11: FY 2019 WATER ENTERPRISE FUND

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money for the purpose of funding the Water Enterprise Fund for the remainder of fiscal year 2019; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Trescott DeWitt moved that the Town vote to transfer from Water Enterprise Free Cash the sum of \$13,000 to replenish the Water Department's maintenance budget line item for the remainder of fiscal year 2019. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 12: FY 2020 WATER ENTERPRISE FUND

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money for the purpose of funding the Water Enterprise Fund for fiscal year 2020; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Trescott DeWitt moved that the Town vote to appropriate the sum of \$781,922 for the Water Enterprise Fund Budget as follows: a) debt repayment, principal and interest – the sum of \$13,718 from water betterments and the sum of \$31,970 from departmental receipts; and b) funds to be allocated between the salaries and expenses of the Water Department – \$736,234 from departmental receipts; all as indicated in the Finance Committee Report; and to authorize the Finance Committee to permit budget line item transfers within the Water Department from salary lines to salary lines and from expense lines to expense lines. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 13: ASSESSMENT FOR MANCHESTER ESSEX REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

To see if the Town will vote to approve the Gross Operating and Maintenance Budget of the Manchester-Essex Regional School District, and raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds a sum of money for the Town's assessment from the District - said sum to be calculated solely in accordance with the "Agreement Between the Towns of Essex and Manchester-by-the-Sea, Massachusetts with Respect to the

Formation of a Regional School District", as most recently amended, by invoking and approving the provision found in paragraph four of Massachusetts General Laws chapter 71, section 16B allowing District members "to reallocate the sum of their required local contributions to the district in accordance with the regional agreement", for the fiscal year beginning July first, two thousand nineteen; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Rachel Fitzgibbon moved that the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,073,441 to fund the Town's assessment from the Manchester Essex Regional School District - said sum to be calculated solely in accordance with the "Agreement Between the Towns of Essex and Manchester-bythe-Sea, Massachusetts with Respect to the Formation of a Regional School District", as most recently amended, by invoking and approving the provision found in paragraph four of Massachusetts General Laws chapter 71, section 16B allowing District members "to reallocate the sum of their required local contributions to the district in accordance with the regional agreement", for the fiscal year beginning July first, two thousand nineteen. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 14: FY 2020 ASSESSMENT FOR ESSEX NORTH SHORE AGRICULTURAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds a sum of money to pay the Town's share of the operating and capital costs of the Essex North Shore Agricultural and Technical School District for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2019; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Christopher Grant moved that the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$282,795 to pay the Town's share of the operating and capital costs of the Essex North Shore Agricultural and Technical School District for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2019. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 15: PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, borrow or any combination thereof, a sum of money to construct a new public safety facility at the site consisting of 11 John Wise Avenue (Map 128, Lot 90) and a portion of 0 Spring Street (Map 128, Lot 102) that abuts John Wise Avenue, including planning, engineering, design, equipping, and furnishing costs, to include the costs of a Project Manager and a Project Designer, and including all construction and/or renovation costs, including the costs of landscaping, site work and paving, moving, demolition and disposal of any existing structures and materials, assessment, containment and/or removal of any hazardous materials, and any and all other costs incidental or related to the project, and that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, be authorized to borrow said sum under M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 7, as amended, or any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefor; that any premium received by the Town upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 20, as amended, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount; and further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen, and any other appropriate officials of the Town, to apply for and accept any forms of financial assistance that may be available to the Town on account of this project, including from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and its Rural Development programs, and in connection therewith to enter into any necessary agreements and otherwise to contract with the USDA for a loan and/or grant; and further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into all agreements and execute on behalf of the Town any and all documents as may be necessary or convenient to effectuate the purposes of this Article; provided, however, that this vote shall not take effect until the Town votes to exempt from the limitation on total taxes imposed by G.L. c.59, §21C (Proposition 2½) the amounts required to pay the principal of and interest on the borrowing authorized by this vote; or to take any other action relating thereto.

Motion #1: Lisa J. O'Donnell moved that the Town vote to transfer from the Sale of Real Estate Fund the sum of \$497,105 for the costs of a Project Manager and a Project Designer to continue to design and to prepare and oversee preparation of plans and specifications sufficient for permitting and competitive bidding for a new public safety facility at the site consisting of 11 John Wise Avenue (Map 128, Lot 90) and a portion of 0 Spring Street (Map 128, Lot 102) that abuts John Wise Avenue, or anything incidental or related thereto. The motion was duly seconded.

The Moderator moved to allow Stewart Roberts, representing the Project Designer, and Tim Dorman, the Project Manager, to each conduct a Presentation. The motion was duly seconded and approved unanimously. After their presentations, the Moderator moved to allow Gregg Corbo, Town Counsel, to review the procedural mechanisms for funding the project. The motion was duly seconded and approved unanimously.

Motion #2: Betsy Madsen moved that any authorized funds be used only to plan for a fire station only facility. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Motion #2 Failed by the Majority declared by the Moderator Action: Motion #1 Approved by the Majority declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 16: CONVEY CONOMO POINT PARCELS

To see if the Town will vote to transfer certain parcels of Town-owned real property at Conomo Point, including 0 Cogswell Road (Map 110, Lot 38) and 0 Sumac Drive (Map 110, Lot 7), which are currently held for purposes of lease, from the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, for general municipal purposes and purposes of conveyance; and to authorize the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to convey said parcels on such terms and for such consideration as the Board deems in the best interests of the Town, and further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to enter into all agreements and to execute any and all instruments as may be necessary or convenient on behalf of the Town to affect said conveyances; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion #1: Lisa J. O'Donnell moved that the Town vote to transfer the following, Town-owned real property at Conomo Point: 0 Cogswell Road (Map 110, Lot 38) and 0 Sumac Drive (Map 110, Lot 7), which are currently held for purposes of lease, from the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, for general municipal purposes and purposes of conveyance; and to authorize the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to convey said parcels on such terms and for such consideration as the Board deems in the best interests of the Town, and further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to enter into all agreements and to execute any and all instruments as may be necessary or convenient on behalf of the Town to affect said conveyances. The motion was duly seconded.

Motion #2: Edward Neal moved that the motion for Article 16 be amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following: That the Town transfer certain parcels of town-owned land at Conomo Point, including 0 Cogswell Road (Map 110, Lot 38) and 0 Sumac Drive (Map 110, Lot 7), which are currently held for purposes of lease, from the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, and that said lots

shall be retained by the Town for the purpose of increasing the available parking at Conomo Point and to authorize the Board of Selectmen, acting as Conomo Point Commissioners, to create simple gravel parking areas on said lots as funds to do so may become available. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Motion #2 Failed by the Majority declared by the Moderator Action: Motion #1 Approved by more than 2/3 vote declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 17: ALIGN SENIOR REAL ESTATE TAX DEFERRAL WITH SENIOR CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT

To see if the Town will vote, in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 59, Section 5, Clause Forty-First A, to adopt as the maximum gross receipts amount to qualify for a senior real estate tax deferral, the same maximum gross receipts amount to qualify for the senior circuit breaker tax credit as a non-head of household, as may be amended from time to time by the Commissioner of Revenue, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 62, Section 6, Subsection k, which amount is currently, \$58,000, or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Susan Coviello moved that the Town vote, in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 59, Section 5, Clause Forty-First A, to adopt as the maximum gross receipts amount to qualify for a senior real estate tax deferral, the same maximum gross receipts amount to qualify for the senior circuit breaker tax credit as a non-head of household, as may be amended from time to time by the Commissioner of Revenue, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 62, Section 6, Subsection k, which amount is currently, \$58,000. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved by the Majority declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 18: TOWN CLERK FEES BYLAW

To see if the Town will vote to amend the General Bylaws, to add a new Section 2-27, to be titled "Town Clerk Fees", as follows, or take any other action relating thereto:

The fee for any service or certificate of the Town Clerk which is not expressly enumerated herein, or in any other provision of the Town's Bylaws or any other applicable law, shall be in the amount set forth in M.G.L. c.262, §34, as may be amended from time-to-time.

Motion: Peter D. Phippen moved that the Town vote to amend the General Bylaws, to add a new Section 2-27, to be titled "Town Clerk Fees", as set forth in the warrant. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 19: MARIJUANA SALES TAX

To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of M.G.L. c.64N, §3 to impose a local sales tax on the sale or transfer of marijuana or marijuana products by a marijuana retailer operating within the Town to anyone other than a marijuana establishment at the rate of 3% of the total sales price received by the marijuana retailer as consideration for the sale of marijuana or marijuana products; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Andrew C. Spinney moved that the Town vote to accept the provisions of M.G.L. c.64N, §3 to impose a local sales tax on the sale or transfer of marijuana or marijuana products by a marijuana retailer operating within the Town to anyone other than a marijuana establishment at the rate of 3% of the total sales price received by the marijuana retailer as consideration for the sale of marijuana or marijuana products. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 20: MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money to design, engineer and construct repairs, upgrades, improvements and/or replacements to the municipal water system, and anything incidental or related thereto; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Trescott DeWitt moved that Article 20 be indefinitely postponed. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 21: MUNICIPAL SEWER SYSTEM

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money to design, engineer and construct repairs, upgrades, improvements and/or replacements to the municipal sewer system and anything incidental or related thereto; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Trescott DeWitt moved that the Town vote to transfer from Sewer Enterprise Free Cash the sum of \$100,000 to design, engineer, construct, and oversee repair, upgrade, improvement, and/or component replacement with regard to the air relief system of the municipal sewer system, and anything incidental or related thereto. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 22: CONOMO POINT SEAWALL

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money to be used as a match to a State grant program for the design and/or construction of renovations and improvements to the Conomo Point seawall system, or anything incidental or related thereto; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Andrew C. Spinney moved that the Town vote to transfer from the Sale of Real Estate Fund the

sum of \$537,300 to be used as a match to a State grant program for the design and/or construction of renovations and improvements to the Conomo Point seawall system, or anything incidental or related thereto. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved Unanimously declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 23: PAVEMENT MARKINGS

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or borrow a sum of money for designing, permitting, and constructing pavement markings relative to on and off-street parking and wayfinding signage in the downtown area, or anything incidental or related thereto; or take any other action relating thereto.

Motion: Peter D. Phippen moved that the Town vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$84,000 for designing, permitting, and constructing pavement markings relative to on and off-street parking and wayfinding signage in the downtown area, or anything incidental or related thereto. The motion was duly seconded.

Action: Approved by the Majority declared by the Moderator
